

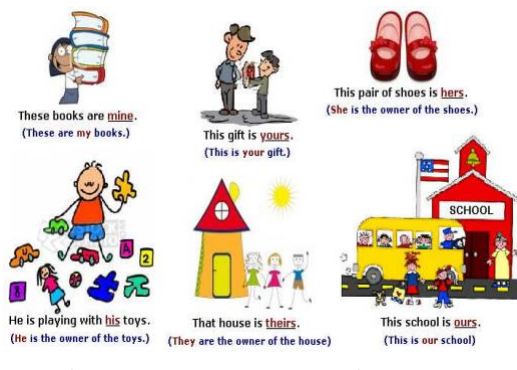
JĘZYK ANGIELSKI KLASA 8

TEMAT: Possessives: adjective and pronouns.

Zaimki dzierżawcze.

Hello students! Hello there!

Nice to see you in our English lesson! Are you ready?



Powtórka z zaimków! Happy ?

Możesz od razu przejść do rozwiązywania zadań i sprawdzenia się.

Zaimków dzierżawczych używamy do określenia tego, co do kogo należy (coś jest: moje, twoje, jej, jego tego, nasze, wasze, ich). Wyróżniamy tutaj **przymiotniki** dzierżawcze (*Possessive Adjectives*), które występują zawsze w towarzystwie rzeczownika, określając tym samym przynależność danej rzeczy lub związek z daną osobą oraz **zaimki** dzierżawcze (*Possessive Pronouns*), które występują samodzielnie.

- **Przymiotniki dzierżawcze (possessives adjectives) zawsze są z rzeczownikiem.**
- **Zaimki dzierżawcze (Possessive Pronouns) występują samodzielnie, bez rzeczownika,**

ponieważ zastępują połączenie przymiotnika z rzeczownikiem. Ich znaczenie w języku polskim jest takie samo jak przy wspomnianych powyżej przymiotnikach dzierżawczych.

Possessive adjectives are used to show possession or ownership of something. While we use them when we refer to people, it is more in the sense of relationship than ownership.

The **possessive adjectives** in English are as follows:

YOUR = Possessive Adjective - You need to bring your dictionary.		ITS = Possessive Adjective - The dog played with its ball.			
YOU'RE = You are (contraction) - You're an excellent student.		IT'S = It is (contraction) - It's very hot right now.

Possessive pronouns are used in English to avoid repeating information that is already clear. In general it makes the sentence less confusing because the same information is not being repeated.

ENGLISH GRAMMAR **Possessive Pronouns** *Woodward ENGLISH*

A Possessive Pronoun replaces a **possessive adjective + noun** to avoid repeating information that is already clear.

- This book is **my book**, not **your book**. (Sounds repetitive)

- This book is **mine**, not **yours**. (Sounds more natural)

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE	POSSESSIVE PRONOUN
MY My shirt is green.	MINE The shirt is mine.
YOUR Your book is new.	YOURS The book is yours.
HIS His pillow is soft.	HIS The pillow is his.
HER Her dog is small.	HERS The dog is hers.
ITS Its bone is old.	---- * * We don't use <i>its</i> as a possessive pronoun.
OUR Our bird is noisy.	OURS The bird is ours.
YOUR Your house is big.	YOURS The house is yours.
THEIR Their car is slow.	THEIRS The car is theirs.
