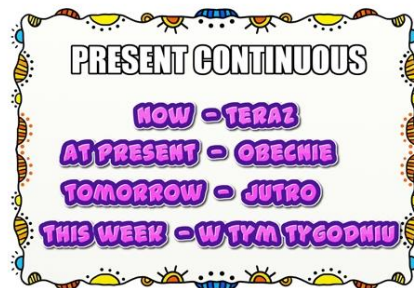
Good morning everyone! How are you today?

Present Simple vs Present Continuous

Verb "to play" Present Simple			
	affirmative	negative	question
I	I play	I don't play	Do I play?
he/she/it	He plays	He doesn't play	Does he play?
you/we/they	You play	You don't play	Do you play?

Verb "to play" - Present Continuous			
	affirmative	negative	question
I	I am playing	I am not playing	Am I playing?
he/she/it	He is playing	He is not playing	Is he playing?
you/we/they	You are playing	You are not playing	Are you playing?




Przypominam, że czas Present Continuous wyraża czynności wykonywane teraz, natomiast Present Simple jest bardziej ogólny i opisuje czynności i stany, które się powtarzają mniej lub bardziej regularnie.

Present Simple vs. Present Continuous Woodward's ENGLISH

Present Simple Tense

1 For facts or things that are always true or generally true.


- Whales **live** in the ocean.
- A dog **has** four legs.
- It **rains** a lot in winter.
- Water **boils** at 100° Celsius.



Present Continuous Tense

1 For an action happening right now at the moment of speaking.


- I **am teaching** an English lesson.
- You **are watching** a video.
- Steve **is washing** his hair.
- She **is taking** her dog for a walk.



Present Simple Tense

2 For regular habits or repeated actions.

- I **brush** my teeth three times a day.
- I **read** in bed every night.
- She **goes** to the gym after work.
- He **walks** to school every day.




Present Continuous Tense

2 To talk about something that is happening AROUND the time of speaking but not necessarily at this exact moment.

- I **am reading** a great book.

It doesn't necessarily mean that I am reading a book right at this moment. It refers to this moment of my life.




Common time expressions used with the present simple tense are:

- always, often, generally, sometimes, never ...
- every day, every week, every year ...
- once a day, twice a week, three times a month ...
- in the morning, in the afternoon, at night

Common time expressions used with the present continuous tense are:

- now, right now
- at the moment
- still




- I **live** in England.

Present Simple Tense
I plan to live in England for a long time and I don't plan to change soon. It is more or less permanent.

- I **am living** in London at the moment.

Present Continuous Tense
The situation is temporary. Next month I plan to live in a different city.




- It **rains** a lot in winter.

Present Simple Tense
This is a fact. It is generally true.

- It **is raining** right now.

Present Continuous Tense
This is an action happening now. The situation is temporary. Tomorrow it might be sunny.

Present Simple vs. Present Continuous (1)

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Mrs White's niece Sophie (stay) with the Whites for a few days.

Sophie (live) and (study) in Liverpool, but she (enjoy) her mid-term break in London at the moment.

She (plan) to do some serious shopping and sightseeing.



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Mrs White's son Arnold (not like) shopping,

but he (love) hanging out with friends.

They usually (go) to the local park where they (play) football or basketball.

Today, however, Arnold (not play) football or basketball;

he (skateboard).

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Mr White (work) for a multinational company. He (not work)

today, however, because he (not feel) well. He phoned in sick.
